Welcome back! But lets be honest, as a year-round swim team some of us haven't really been away since the end of the summer season. ;)

I want to take this opportunity to congratulate our parent board on a year's worth of dedication and leadership. Three major tasks were accomplished this past year and required many volunteer hours.

First, we added a meet (Pirate Plunge) while maintaining our two other spring/summer meets and the 13&O State meet. This was no easy task. It took 2-3 meetings to decide to do this (the importance of which was to maintain our three spring/summer meets for 2016).

Second, I presented a fee comparison document and there were many months of discussion in regards to our current fee structure. In a nutshell, we are not charging enough for the services we offer ... even after fees were raised 20%.

Third, we developed another fulltime coach position complete with benefits. There are not many teams in Wisconsin who are in position to pay two fulltime coaches and we need to be proud of this accomplishment.

Additionally, we have restructured the parent board with the major changes coming from splitting the VP and registration positions, adding an official position, deleting any redundant positions (co-

fundraising and co-meet director), and deleting parent liaisons positions since all parent board members serve in that capacity.

At the parent board level we have developed season objectives and currently they are: become a 501(c)3 organization, engage parents to become involved at the committee level, and develop job descriptions for the various parent board positions (more could be added to this as the season progresses).

In a nutshell, there is a lot of work going on behind the scenes with the "dry-side" of our sport and we are blessed to have caring professional parents assisting with moving our team forward. Welcome back everybody!

Sprint Time Trials

Our first "official" competition will take place October 15 at Park High School with warm-ups beginning at 5:30 p.m.

This year the 50 underwater dolphin kick has been added for the senior level swimmers and advanced 12&U athletes. It will be the first event of the

meet. More about this exciting new experience as we get closer to the event.

We will need a minimum of 13 parent timer volunteers along with 3-4 volunteer officials.
